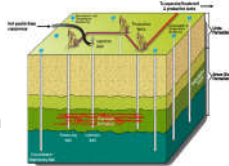

What Paul Harris Wrote



One of the more interesting traditions of Rotary is to address members by their first names and to avoid using titles. This was not an accident. Titles are earned, and they set people off for their accomplishments. They have their role. However, friendships are earned through an entirely different mechanism, and titles inhibit friendships by separating people into various distinctions. Paul Harris explained this concept beautifully in just three sentences. Moreover, he made it clear that the playful nature of most Rotary meetings was not at all accidental. *"Their meetings were different from meetings of other clubs of the day; they were far more intimate, far more friendly. First names were always used, while 'Misters' and all other prefixes which might in any way interfere with the free flow of spirits, were banned. They became boys once again."*

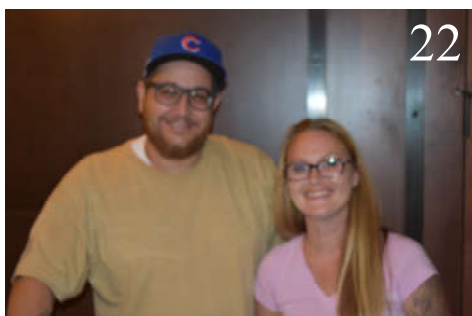
