As of January 1, 2008, we had 44 members. We meet Wednesdays from 7:10-8:30 a.m. at the Legacy Ridge Golf Course, 10801 Legacy Ridge Parkway. Through our weekly meetings, the work of various committees, our fund raising efforts,

and the support of our club foundation and the RI Foundation, we strongly support the Four Avenues of Service of Rotary International.

Club Service

Club Service is concerned with activities which make a Rotary club what it is and make it possible for the club to live up to the motto "Service Above Self". It includes arranging our weekly meetings and programs, recruiting and orienting new members, preparing our club directory, and publishing our club newsletter and web site. It also includes responsibility for fellowship.

Community Service

Community Service is concerned with our activities focused on the local community and includes hands-on programs such as volunteer reading programs in elementary schools, collecting used computers and donating them to needy students, (our

signature program, C4K, which, to date, has donated over 6,600 computers), Memorial Garden cleanup, and the collection and distribution of food baskets. It also includes our fundraising efforts that, through the club's foundation, support a wide variety of good works, with a major emphasis on supporting youth in the community.

Vocational Service

Vocational Service includes programs emphasizing ethics in business, job fairs, excellence in performance of one's vocation, and working with youth in a variety of ways, including sending young people to an annual Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) camp, and an Interact club at a local high school. We also award 8-10 students college scholarships each year.

International Service

International Service includes our Youth Exchange Program. We send Westminster youth to other countries and host exchange students in our homes. We also support a variety of good works in other countries such as a St. Vincent medical program, a Latvia dental clinic program, Village Banks in Guatemala, a

school for girls in Uganda, a Socially Conscious School in Brazil, and support of a Group Study Exchange program which sends teams from Colorado to other countries and hosts

teams from other countries here.

Committees

Committees are the "engine of Rotary" and all our members serve on one or more committees which reflect their particular service interests. The work of the committees is guided by our Board of Directors which meets once a month and is responsible for the ongoing management of the club. Our initiation fee is \$100, and quarterly dues, including breakfast, are \$195.

Rotary International

As Rotarians we are part of a truly unique worldwide organization. The first Rotary club was founded in 1905 by a Chicago lawyer, Paul Harris. Since then, RI has grown to become one of the largest service clubs in the world, with over 1,200,000 members in some 32,000 clubs in 168 countries.
